*Bid Challenges on Both Sides of the Atlantic:
Views from the Bench and Bar***

Bid challenges -- known as "protests" in the United States, and "remedies" in Europe -- are a vital part of any modern procurement system. Senior members of the U.S. procurement community, Judge Marian Blank Horn (U.S. Court of Federal Claims), Ralph White (Government Accountability Office) and Paul Khoury (Wiley Rein) will join senior members of the UK and European procurement bench and bars for a roundtable discussion on bid challenges -- a comparative assessment of how remedies have evolved on both sides of the Atlantic, and an open exchange on best practices for the future.
